Patriotism – Courage – Perseverance – Loyalty – Citizenship – Peace – Leadership

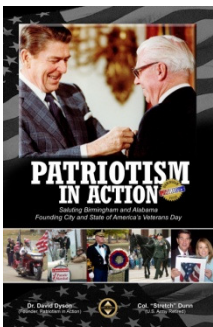
They started writing vision statements for how they can fulfill those traits.



The students and parents watched a two-minute video clip of President Reagan honoring Raymond Weeks of Birmingham at the White House 30 years ago. Reagan presented Weeks the Presidential Citizens Medal, proclaimed him the "driving force" for establishing Veterans Day, and added, "Your country is mighty grateful for what you've done."

They applauded when learning and seeing the Governor's Proclamation and the Congressional Record.
